Chariots of Fire (Journal Entry#10 = 30 pts/Due Monday, 6.5.17)

- Background- The film's title was inspired by the line, "Bring me my chariot of fire," from the William Blake poem adapted into the popular British hymn "Jerusalem"; the hymn is heard at the end of the film. The original phrase "chariot(s) of fire" is from 2 Kings 2:11 and 6:17 in the Bible.
- What do you think the title of this film/book means? Why? (Hint: Research the bible verse too...)
- What is a central theme of the story that is found in many of the pieces of literature we have read this year or films we have viewed? (Be specific: describe a scene that depicts this & explain in detail why this is true...)
- What overall moral lesson might this true story & film teach us?
 Why?
